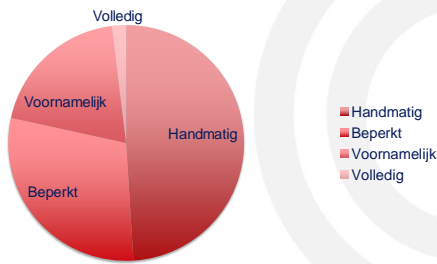

- Agile Development: Tests are often repeated
- Economic developments: Organizations must survive the coming years with less budget. However, to get along much should be invested in IT.
- Shorter time-to-market, CI: Testing must be performed faster
- Growth in complexity: Testing technical interfaces and tooling is necessary here.
- Mobile: Different platforms and devices: Tests are often repeated, this feeds the Business Case for automation.

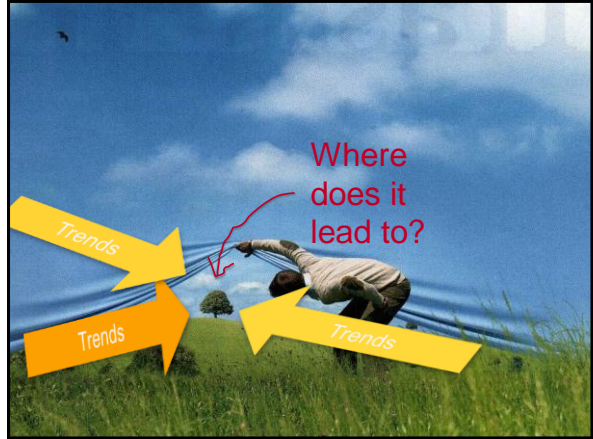
